

Certification of Registered Contractor's Licenses (Grandfathering)

House Bill 269, which passed during the 2013 legislative session, was approved by Governor Rick Scott on June 14, 2013. This bill will re-open and extend the time period for electrical, alarm, and specialty electrical contractors to request that their registered contractor's license be grandfathered to a state wide certified contractor's license. The time

period requesting grandfathering of registered licenses has been extended until November 1, 2015. The re-opening of the grandfathering time period will take effect on July 1, 2013. Registered contractors may submit their application for grandfathering of their licenses beginning July 1, 2013.

I Can Choose My Own Judge?

You probably know that under normal circumstances when you file a case in the Court system, a judge is randomly assigned to the case. We do have certain judges that take certain types of cases, but there are generally more than one available for each type of case and there is some "chance" to who will be your judge. We also know that these judges generally have more than a thousand cases assigned to them at any given time. This results in various problems. One problem is that when you are before a Judge, he has a limited capacity to remember just what your case is about and what rulings have been previously made and why. Most Judges are fairly adept at this and they do keep notes to help them, but the sheer number of cases that they handle limits how deep their knowledge will be.

Another problem that the judicial caseload presents is the difficulty we have in obtaining hearing time. Sometimes once the matter has been heard by the Court, whether a hearing or trial, it can take months to receive a ruling from the Court. Again, the high volume of cases has an impact on how quickly things happen through the Court. We would presume that if the Court is taking the time it needs then the quality of the decisions should not be impaired.

Many of us are aware that Arbitration can be a viable alternative to litigation in that the result is an enforceable (through the Court) order. Arbitration is often touted as being superior to litigation in that that arbitrator may have substantial experience in the field that is relevant to the case. Further, the arbitrator's schedule is usually such that you can readily obtain a final hearing date or other time needed with the arbitrator. However, there are large drawbacks to arbitration. First, there are only limited circumstances under which an arbitration award can be appealed. Second, the arbitrator is not required to follow the Rules of Evidence or even case law precedent. This makes the outcome of an arbitration far less predictable.

So, how do we solve these problems? How do we find a judge with some experience in the type of case we have, who has hearing time readily available, who can conduct a trial within a reasonable time, who will enforce the rules of evidence, follow the case law and whose rulings we can appeal? Simple, hire your own trial resolution judge.

Florida Statute 44.104 provides that two or more opposing parties who are involved in a civil dispute may agree to submit the matter to a voluntary trial judge for resolution so long as there is no constitutional issue involved. The "voluntary trial judge" must be a member of the Florida Bar, in good standing for at least 5 years. His (or her) rulings are enforced through the Circuit Court and are fully appealable. The rules of evidence apply in the proceedings. For all intents and purposes, the appointed voluntary trial judge has all necessary powers as if he were a Circuit Court Judge for the case. The major difference being that the litigants pay the voluntary trial judge for his or her time. Access to the voluntary trial judge for hearings and for trial should therefore be far superior than when dealing with a Circuit Court Judge. So, if your case is time sensitive, or you believe a certain expertise is required, or you simply don't like going to the courthouse, you might consider engaging a voluntary trial judge

ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS' LICENSING BOARD **GRANDFATHERING LICENSES** **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

1. What is "Grandfathering" of a registered contractor's license?

Grandfathering allows a currently registered contractor to apply for and receive a state wide certified contractor's license in their same category of licensure without sitting for the state contractor's examination if the contractor meets certain criteria set forth in [Section 489.514, Florida Statutes](#).

2. What are the requirements I must meet for my registered license to be "grandfathered"?

In order to have your registered contractor's license grandfathered, you must:

1) Currently hold a valid state-registered license in one of the contractor categories defined in [Section 489.505\(2\)\(a\)&\(b\), \(12\), or \(19\), Florida Statutes](#).

2) Have, for that category, passed a written, proctored examination that the board finds to be substantially similar to the examination required to be licensed as a certified contractor under this part. For purposes of this subsection, a written, proctored examination such as that produced by the National Assessment Institute, Block and Associates, NAI/Block, Exterior Assessments, Professional Testing, Inc., or Assessment Systems, Inc., shall be considered to be substantially similar to the examination required to be licensed as a certified contractor. The board may not impose or make any requirements regarding the nature or content of these cited examinations.

3) Have at least 5 years of active state-registered experience as a contractor in that contracting category, or as an inspector or building administrator with oversight over that category, at the time of application.

4) Have not had your contractor's license revoked at any time, had your contractor's license suspended within the last 5 years, or been assessed a fine in excess of \$500 within the last 5 years.

5) Be in compliance with the insurance and financial responsibility requirements in [Section 489.515\(1\)\(b\), Florida Statutes](#).

3. When will I be able to apply to have my registered license grandfathered?

House Bill 269, which passed during the 2013 legislative session, will re-open and extend the time period for contractors to request that their registered contractor's license be grandfathered to a state wide certified contractor's license beginning July 1, 2013. All applications for grandfathering must be postmarked no later than November 1, 2015 to be considered for grandfathering.

4. What is the application fee?

The application fee is \$205.00.


